Figure 1. Year of Publication

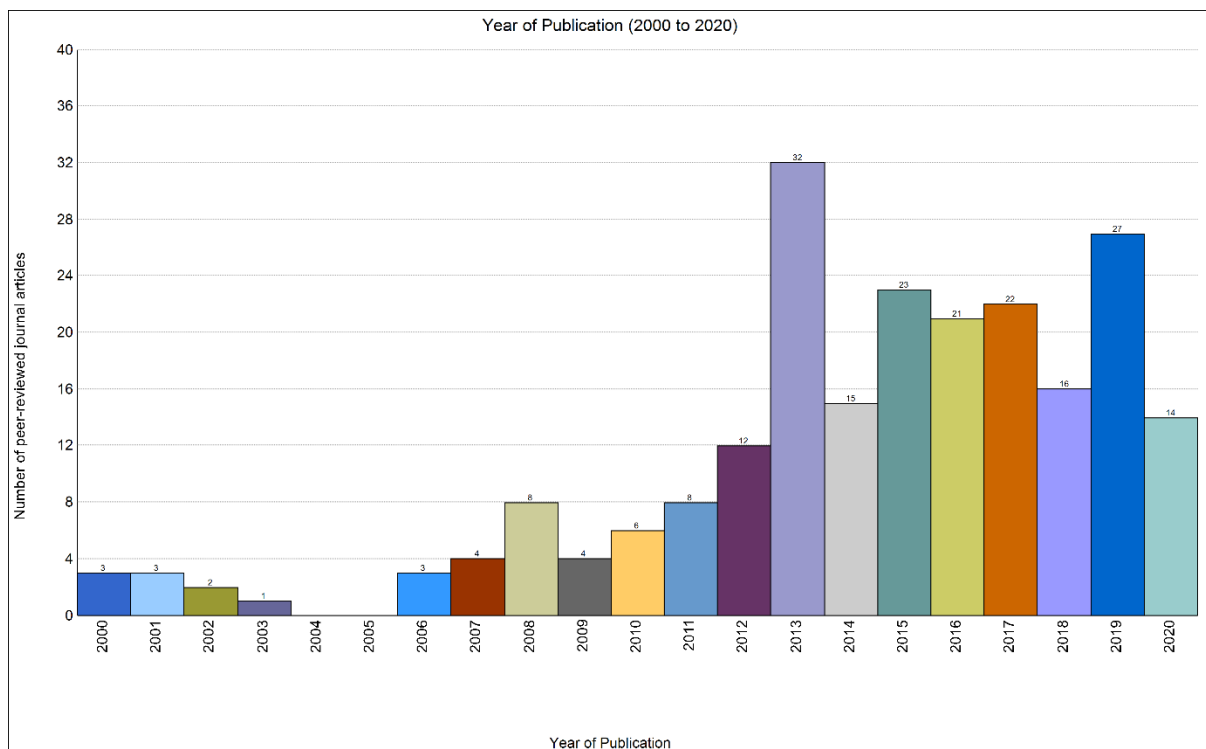

Figure 2. Researcher Location

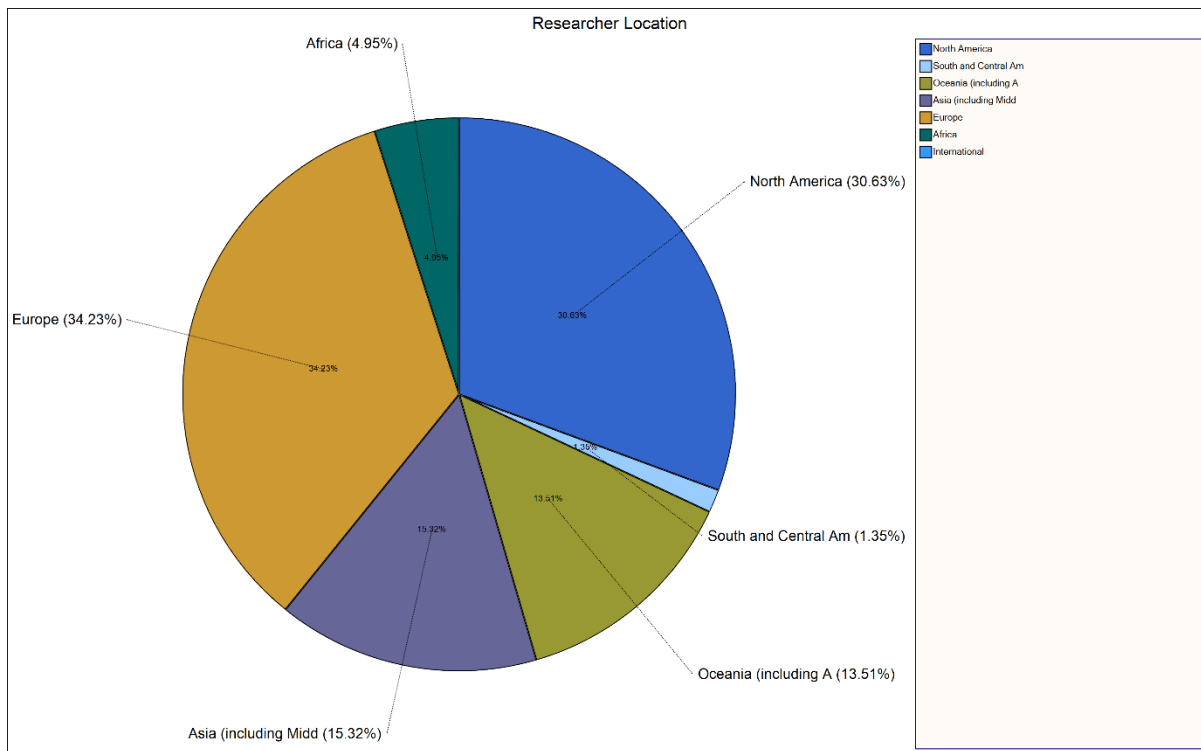


Figure 3. Location of Research

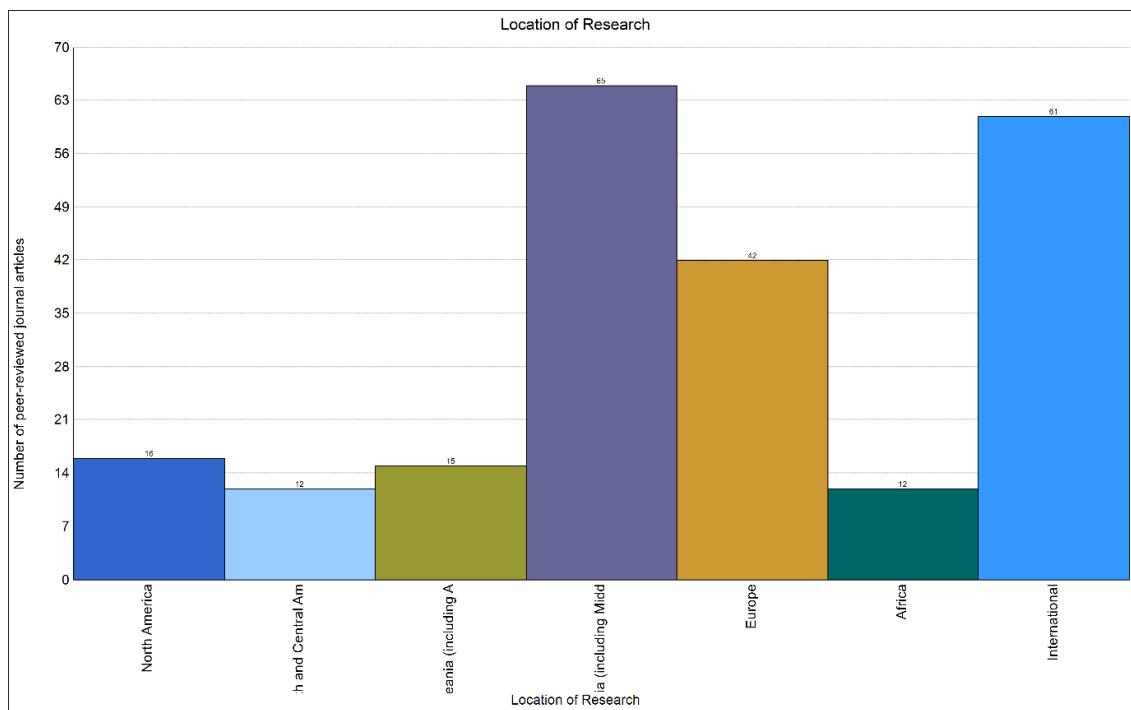


Figure 4. Research Approach

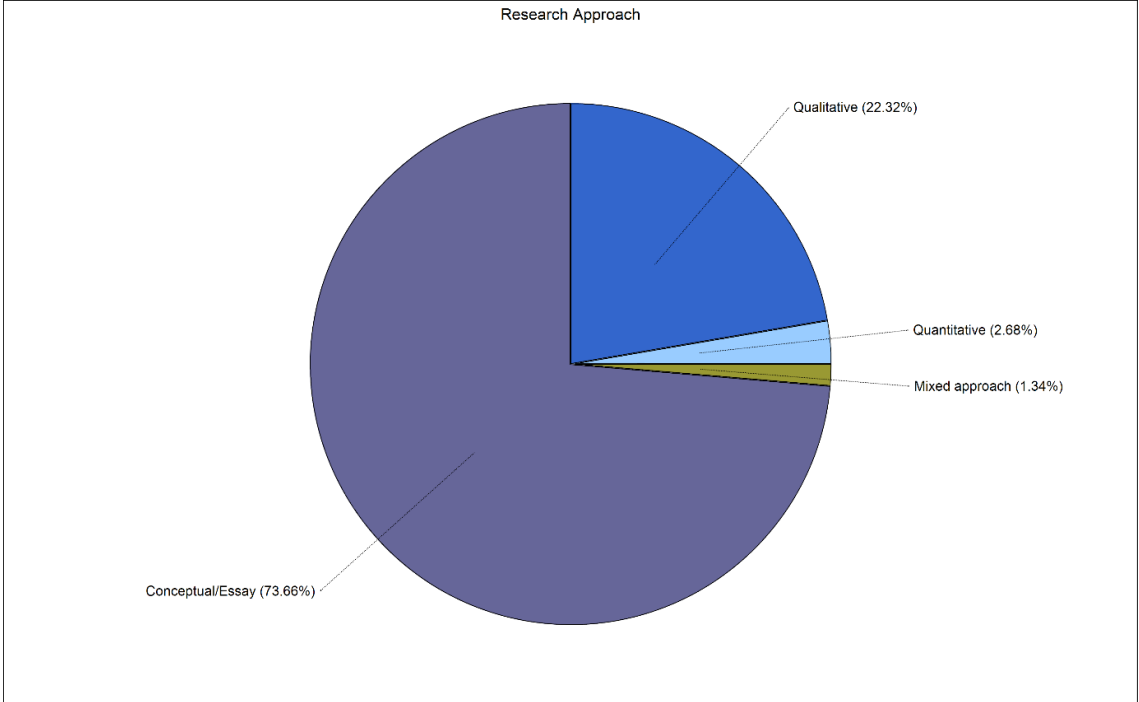


Figure 5. Data Collection Methods

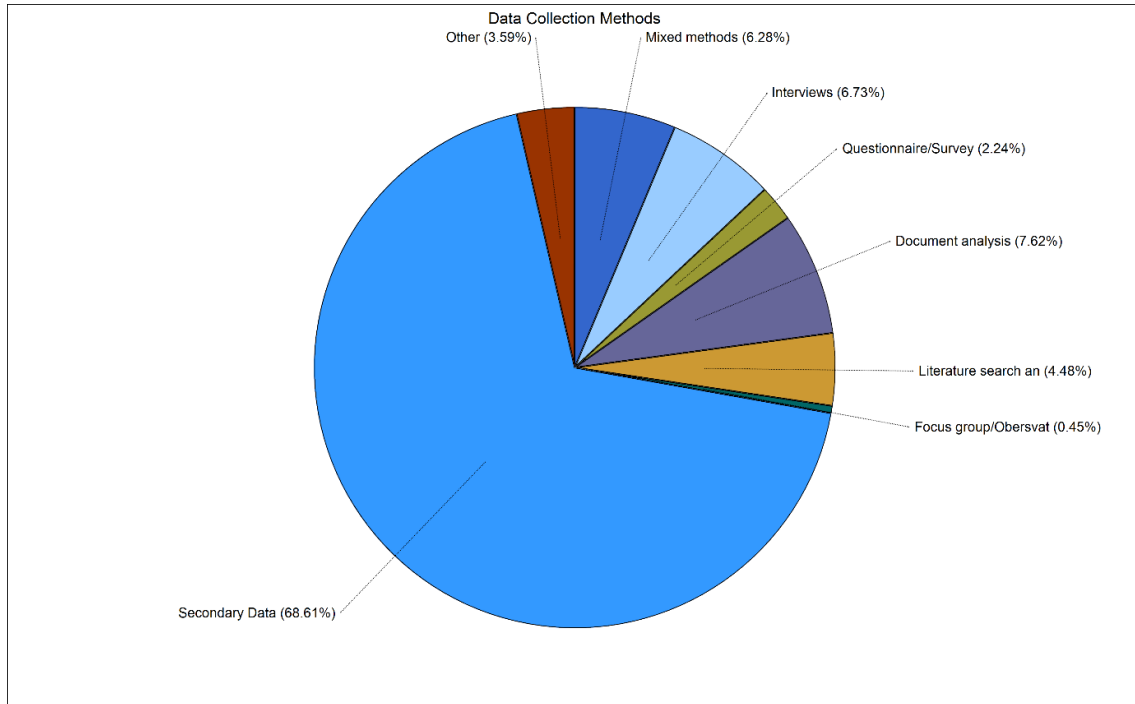


Figure 6. References to Theories

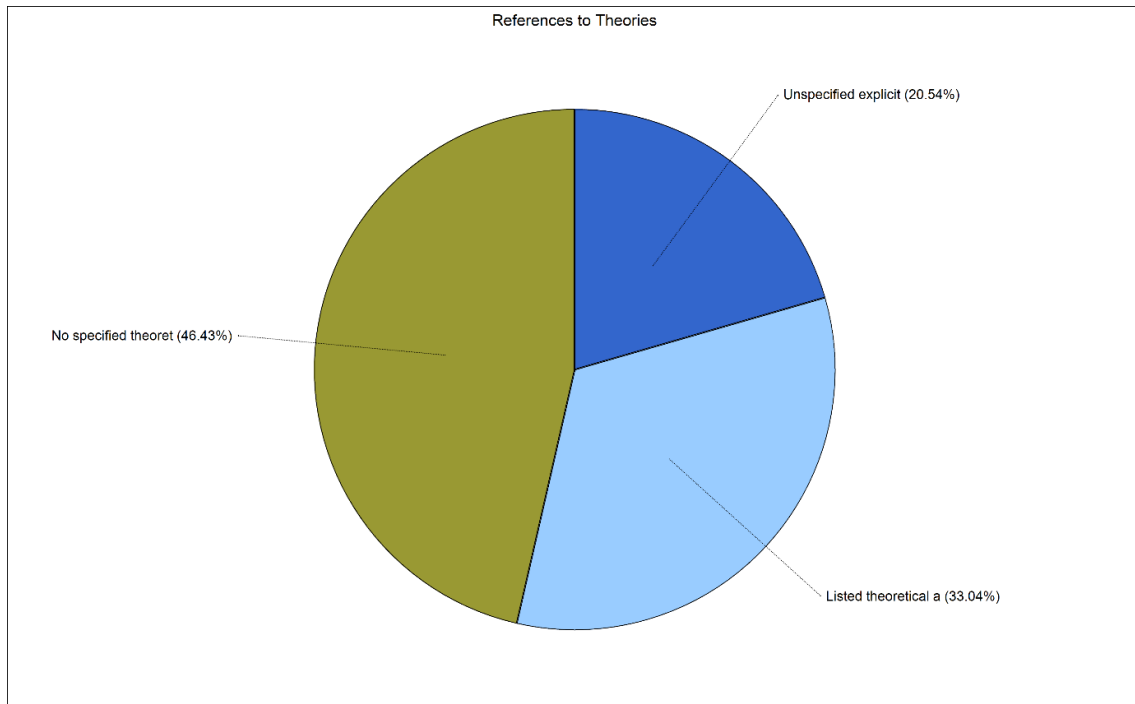


Figure 7. Type of Diplomatic Activity Addressed

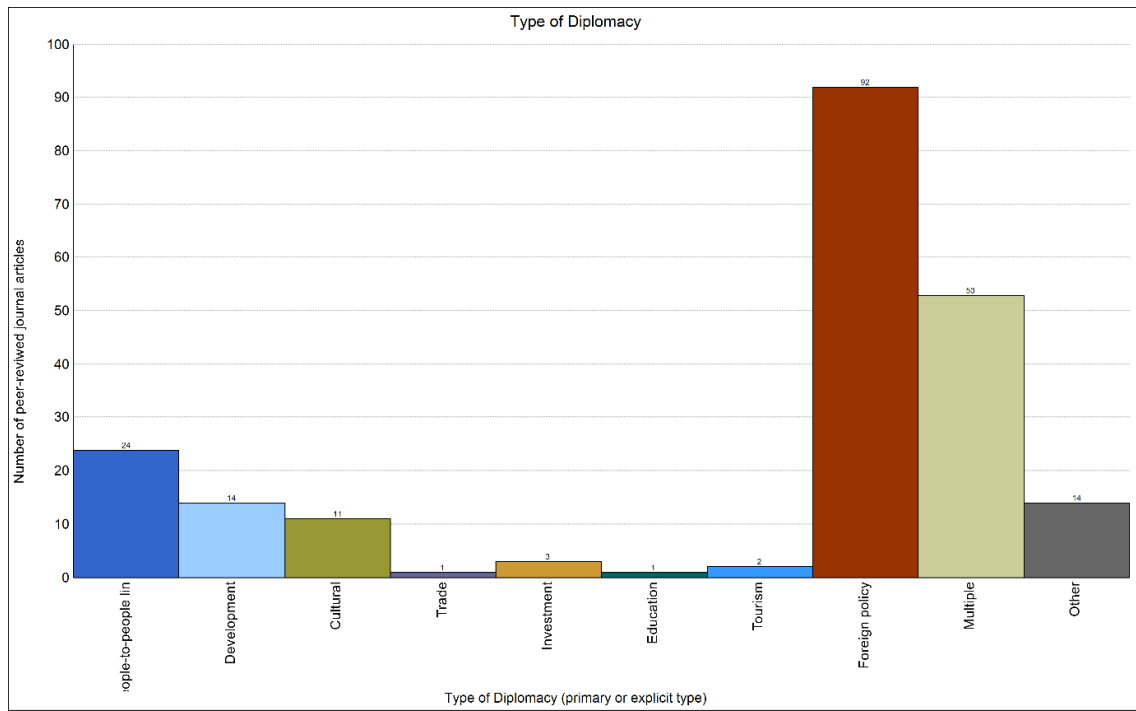


Figure 8. Agent of Diplomacy

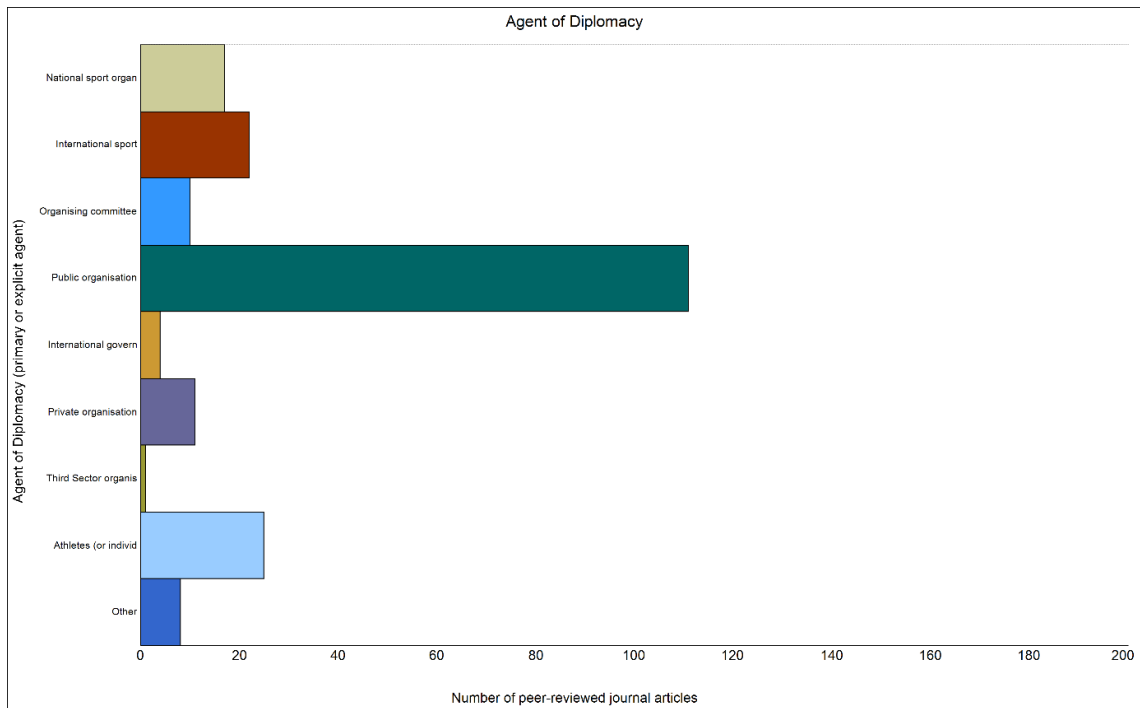


Figure 9. Theme of Diplomatic Outcome

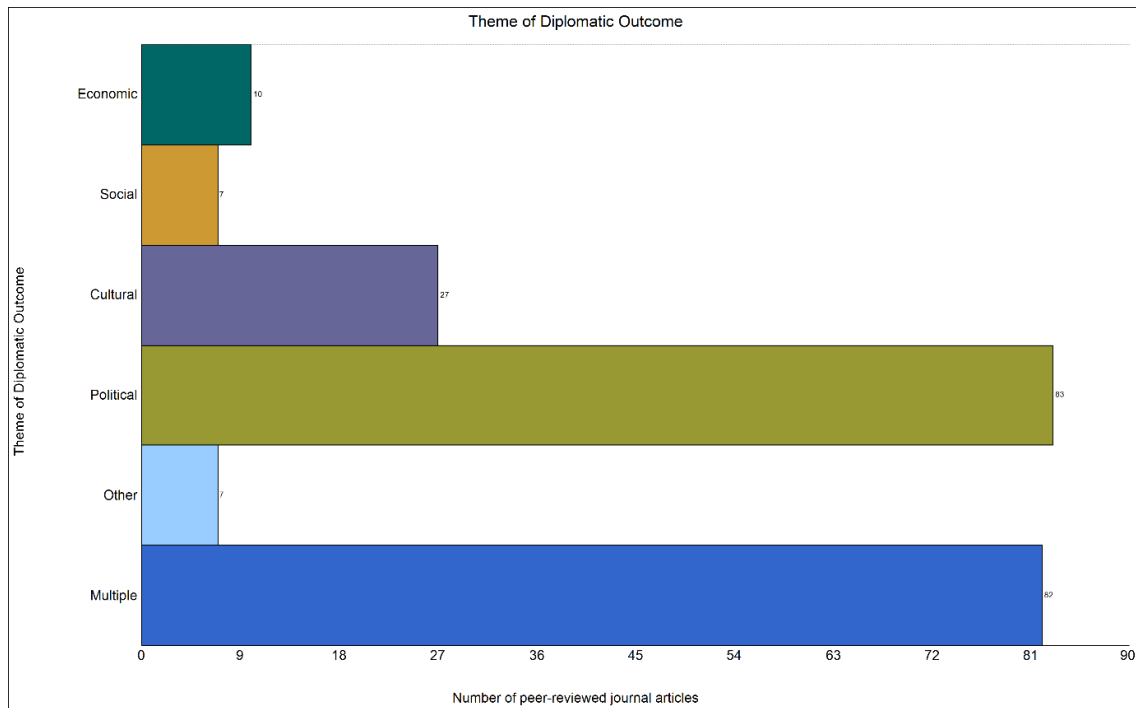


Figure 10. Type of Sporting Activity
